





Current Sentiment Among Religious Organizations





In late April, CCS distributed a

We collected nearly1,200 responsesincluding over100 from religiousorganizations.








Current Sentiment Among Donors

In 2020, what do you anticipate will happen to the amount you usually donate to nonprofit organizations as a result of COVID-19?




Thinking of COVID-19, which of the following best describes how you plan to support nonprofit organizations this year?

This year I plan to...

- 43% Continue to primarily give to the nonprofits I usually support, as they will be probably be impacted by COVID-19 in some way
- 21% I don't know / haven't thought about this
- 16% Shift my giving to support some new nonprofits responding to COVID-19, but also continue giving to organizations I have supported in the past
- 12% Continue to primarily give to the nonprofits I usually support, as I am not really concerned about giving in response to COVID-19
- 8% Shift my giving to primarily support nonprofits responding to COVID-19

Virtual Engagement

Based on a rapid review of all parishes in 16 dioceses across the country over the past two months...

Virtual Platform	Average Percentage of Parishes Who Use This Platform	Average Percentage of Parishes Who Mention Offertory on This Platform
Website	82%	35%
Facebook Page	84% (67% up-to-date)	12%
Live Streaming Mass	59%	17%
Online Bulletin	73% (60% up-to-date)	46%

...parishes are making great strides in fostering virtual communities, but opportunity exists to bolster offertory giving through virtual communications.
