

Dyan Sublett

President, MLK Community Health Foundation

Dyan Sublett brings a background of over thirty years in philanthropic work throughout greater Los Angeles to her current position as President of the MLK Community Health Foundation, providing philanthropic support for the new Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Hospital and the community it serves in South LA. As the organization's founding executive, she was responsible for developing the Foundation's board, establishing its brand messaging, donor base and infrastructure, and integrating vision and strategy with hospital leadership. Successes since 2012 include over \$25 million in funds raised for capital projects and community programs.

Formerly Dyan was Executive Vice President, Development and Communications, for the YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles, one of the largest YMCA associations in North America. Her leadership included \$120 million in contributed revenue, and eight North American YMCA communications awards. Dyan has also served as Senior Vice President for Advancement and Communications at the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County, Senior Vice President for Institutional Advancement at Art Center College of Design, Vice President for Development at Sundance Institute, and Senior Development Director at the University of California Los Angeles, where she co-founded and directed UCLA's Women and Philanthropy Program. She is Vice Chair of the board for Indiana University's College of Arts and Sciences. Past board memberships include the University of Massachusetts, Planned Parenthood Los Angeles, the Mayor's Nonprofit Advisory Group, and the Creede (Colorado) Repertory Theater. Dyan serves as the Minister of Congregational Giving for St. Alban's Episcopal Church.

Dyan's work on women and philanthropy has been used as a model for nonprofits nationwide. She is a contributing writer to the book [Women as Donors, Women as Philanthropists](#), a commentator for the Chronicle of Philanthropy, and a frequent public speaker and consultant with organizations throughout the nonprofit sector. She received a B.A. with Honors from Indiana University, and a Master of Fine Arts degree in Creative Writing from the University of Massachusetts.
